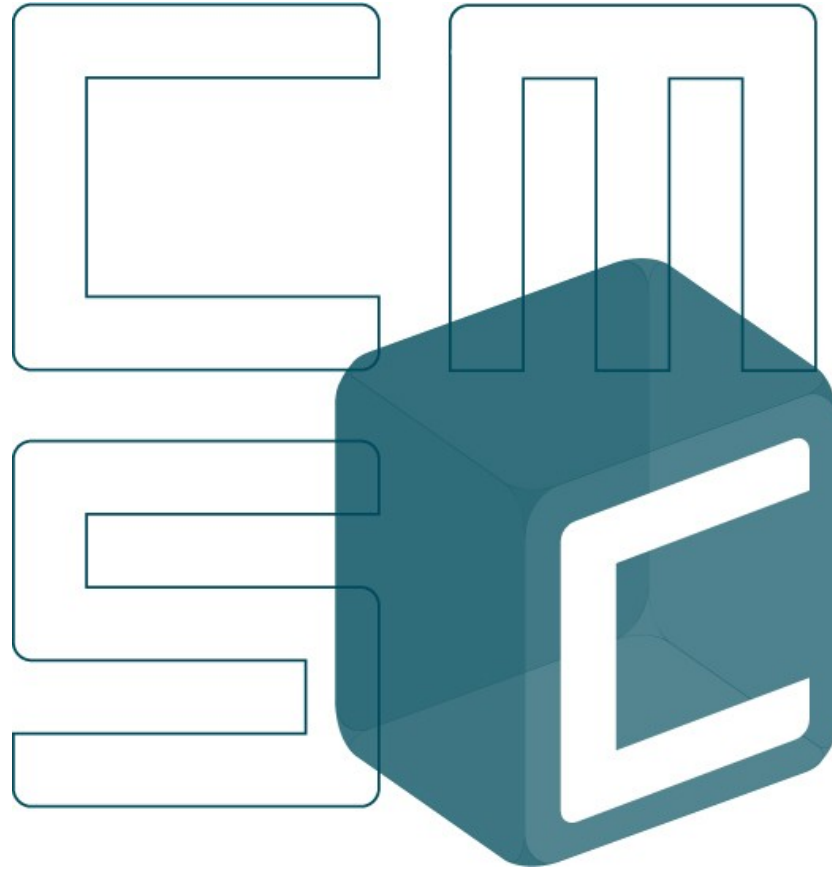

- Using open standards
- Standard build procedure over multiple projects
- Clear project structure for CMS Container and customers projects.

Life is easy

- Easy to create new modules
- Easy to create new layouts and views
- Easy to use paging
- All thanks to a robust module structure.



It takes two to tango



- Separation between content and site structure
- (Almost) no dependencies between these
- Flexible rights structure which will allow both very strict and/or very simple user rights

Total control

- User and time friendly editors
- Unique full editable tree based structures for both the repository and the site management
- Very easy making lists
- Responsive layout of the editors



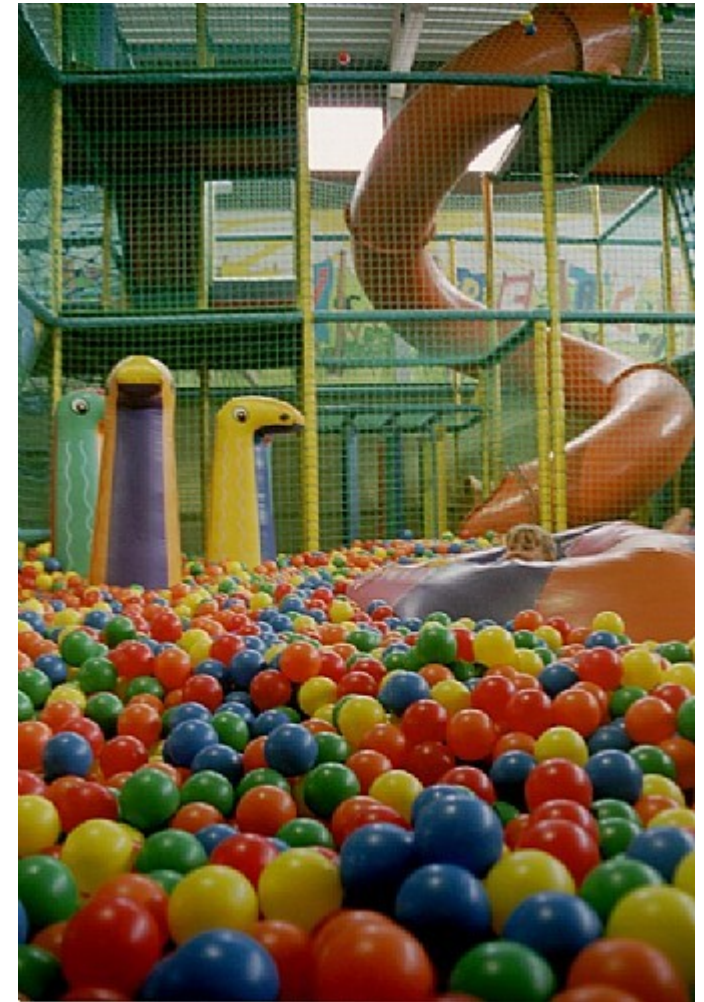
Secure workflow



- Quick and stable replicating publishing system
- Optional 3 or 4 layers workflow
- Complete separator between “live” and “staging”.

Click and play

- Clicking your sites together using advanced portlet technology
- WYSIWYG editors
- Implementing portal spec JSR 168

- Upgrade webapp by only deploying one war
- All configuration outside the war
- One war to run on different servers
